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Has your workforce received sufficient fire warden training?

The Regulatory Reform Fire Safety Order 2005 requires a responsible person(s) to manage fire safety in all workplaces.

The 'responsible person' is usually the employer, manager or owner of the premises. Other members of staff may also undertake roles as fire wardens.

Fire wardens have specific duties to perform to ensure that everyone can leave an establishment safely and as quickly as possible in the event of a fire.

Everyone in the workplace needs to be familiar with the fire warden's role, including the regular checks that they must make and the protocols that they will lead during a real fire. 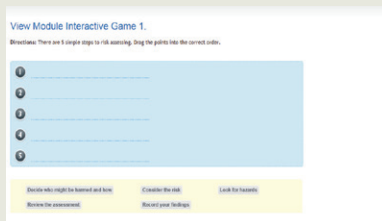
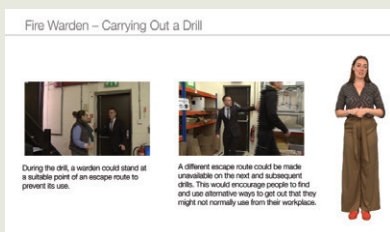
What does the fire warden course cover?
