Any uncertainty as to who is the Client should be resolved by considering who:

Ultimately decides what is to be constructed, where, when and by whom;

or

commissions the design and construction work (the employer in contract terminology);

or

initiates the work;

or

is at the head of the procurement chain;

or

Whoever appoints the principal contractor and the principal designer.

Who is this training for?

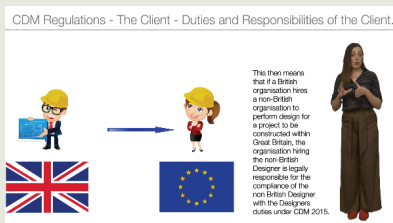

The “Client” is the person or organisation who wants the construction work done and this does not depend on whoever is funding the project.

Where the project involves more than one contractor, the Client duties must instead be carried out by the Principal Contractor . If the Domestic Client has not appointed a Principal Contractor the duties of the Client will be carried out by the Contractor in control of the construction work.
